Dear Director Moncano:

We are pleased to inform you that the **Mines and Geosciences Bureau (MGB)** is **ELIGIBLE** for the grant of Performance-Based Bonus (PBB) for the Fiscal Year 2020. However, considering that the MGB failed to meet the **PhilGEPS posting** requirement and two out of five (2/5) Procurement-GASS requirements, the following should be **isolated** and **excluded** from the FY 2020 PBB ranking:

- The unit/s or person/s from the MGB-CARAGA responsible for the noncompliance with the **PhilGEPS Posting requirement**;
- The unit/s or person/s from the MGB- CO, ROs 2, and 13 responsible for the non-compliance with the submission of **FY 2020 APP non-CSE** requirement; and
- The unit/s or person/s from the MGB- CAR, ROs 1, 4A, 7, 8, 9, 11, and 13 responsible for the non-compliance with the **Undertaking of Early Procurement for at least 50% of goods and services**.

The summary of the final IATF assessment result is attached.

More than the incentive, we hope that the PBB has significantly contributed to your agency's organizational and employee performance, leading to concrete and visible improvements in the delivery of goods and services to the public. To complete the PBB process, may we remind the publication of the **FY 2020 Agency Scorecard** in the MGB website or official publication. Please coordinate with the AO25 Technical Secretariat for the finalization of the said report cards.





Furthermore, please be informed that the criteria and conditions for the grant of the FY 2021 PBB have been improved to strengthen the effectiveness of the incentives system in helping agencies achieve the mission-critical objectives and expected outcomes of the government. These improvements aim to measure and evaluate agency performance with emphasis on the public's satisfaction on the realization of the agencies' performance targets, quality of service delivery, efficiency in the use of resources, and strengthened agency stewardship.

Again, we commend the MGB management and staff and wish you all safety.
